#### Description

Drive up a to a scenically wonderful coastal road before you reach the ancient city of Ephesus. The first place you will visit on this exciting tour will be the **Virgin Mary's House**. Archaeological evidence shows that the little house dates from the 6th century but that the foundations were from the first century. Next you will visit the **Ephesus ruins**, predominantly from the later Roman period. Visit the "**Terrace Houses**" located opposite **Hadrian's Temple**. The wealthy and important people of Ephesus used these houses, which are finely decorated with mosaics and frescoes giving a true impression of the ancient lifestyle. Then, your tour will continue to the ruins of the **Basilica of St John**. The Basilica had a cruciform plan with four domes along its longitudinal axis and a pair flanking the central dome to form the arm of the cross. Under the central dome was the grave of St John. **Lunch** will be served at a lovely local restaurant in the town of Selcuk, Return to Kusadasi.

#### Description

Drive up a to a scenically wonderful coastal road before you reach the ancient **Ephesus**. Famous in antiquity for its temple of Diana, during the years of the Roman Empire, the Greek port of Ephesus became the greatest city in Asia Minor. Ancient Ephesus is one of the greatest outdoor museums in Turkey and perhaps in the world. Although now in ruins, it was originally founded by the Carian and Leleg native peoples. Your two-hour walking tour begins after a 30-minute drive from the pier. Magnificent vistas await - including the glorious Celsus Library façade, the Grand Amphitheater and the Temple of Hadrian. The Terrace Houses owned by the wealthy and influential lie opposite Hadrian's Temple, in a newly excavated section. Their fine decorative mosaics and frescoes give a fascinating insight into ancient lifestyles. Terrace Houses on the slopes of Bulbul Mountain are accessed by steps, with their roofs forming terraces for those houses above them.

Whether or not she died in Ephesus was not known until Anne Catherine Emmerich's vision. The stigmatized German nun who had never been to Ephesus had a vision of the House of the Virgin Mary and described it in detail to the German writer Clemens Brentano who later published a book about it. Officially declared a shrine of the Roman Catholic Church in 1896, became a popular place of pilgrimage. Continue your visit with the ancient city of Ephesus. ### Description

After meeting your private, professional guide at the Kusadasi pier, you will begin your full-day private shore excursion and head to the ancient city of **Ephesus**. Here you will explore this historic, fascinating destination with your private guide and marvel at the sights of the Odeon, the Upper Agora, the Fountain of Trajan, the Steam Baths of Scolastika, the Temple of Hadrian, and the impressive Library of Celsus, considered one of the most magnificent ruins from the ancient world. Your guide will bring these sites to life. The Grand Theater, where St. Paul preached to the Ephesians, was until recently still used for performances. Next you will set off to the ancient city of Miletus was one of the biggest cities in ancient Anatolia. Miletus is perhaps most famous for its great philosophers and architects, such as Thales, Anaksimandros, Hippodamos and Isidoros. Miletus is also famous for the Faustina Baths. Although it has not been restored or studied to the extent that Ephesus has, it is still an important look into the life of this ancient civilization. You will then visit the archeological site of Didyma, which is not an ancient city, but a sacred place of worship. Didyma's fame rests on the magnificent Temple of Apollo, a building of awesome scale whose proportions seem more in keeping with the gods than man. Building works in the name of Apollo were started in the eighth or seventh centuries B.C. The Persians, who attacked the area in 494 B.C., destroyed the temple. Alexander the Great helped in the rebuilding and the remains we see today are Hellenistic, dating from his times. In the temple's reconstruction, the original foundations were used but the size of the building was greatly increased. While in Didyma, you will have a traditional Turkish lunch.At the conclusion of your private cruise excursion you will return to Kusadasi along the same route taken in the morning.

#### Description

After meeting your specially trained professional guide on the Kusadasi pier, you will set out for your private **Ephesus** shore excursion. Of all the ancient cities mentioned in the New Testament that were visited by St. Paul, Ephesus is the only one that was also addressed in the Book of Revelation. Near the north gate is the **Tomb of St. Luke**. It is thought to be the foundation of an ancient temple that was later converted into a church. A bull's head carved in the doorjamb once led people to believe that this was the tomb of St. Luke, since the bull's head was an ancient symbol for him. Although it is not clear if he ever visited Ephesus in person, certainly his influence did. Visit the Great Theater, where Paul preached that gods made by human hands are not gods at all (Acts 19:26). This led to many of the citizens rising up violently. You will see the Temple of Serapis, built for Egyptian travelers in 2 A.D.; it was later converted into a Church dedicated to St. John. St.Paul returned to Ephesus in 40 A.D. with the Virgin Mary. It is believed that they both lived here until their deaths. Before leaving the city, you will walk to the area that was once the harbor. Here, you will view the remains of The Church of Mary, an ancient Christian cathedral dedicated to the Virgin Mary. It is believed that this is where Mary prayed during her final years. The same church is also known as one of the Seven Churches of the Apocalypse mentioned in Revelations. After exploring all the fascinating Biblical sites, your private Ephesus shore excursion includes lunch at a nearby restaurant, where you will enjoy many local favorites. After lunch, you will pass the one lone pillar that is all that remains of The Temple of Artemis (550 B. C. - 401 A. D.), one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. The final stop is at the Basilica of St. John. It is generally agreed that he died in the area of Ephesus of natural causes

The square was laid out in the late 1800's near a Taksim (branching-point) in the city's water distribution system. At the southern end of the square is a statue of the founder of modern day Turkey, Kemal Atatürk. Walking to the far side of the square you come to the beginning of Istiklal Caddesi (Independence Avenue) which is the main artery of the Beyoglu district. Now a pedestrian way, it is the city's most popular strolling, shopping and meeting street. #### Description

Once you board your coach drive up a to a scenically wonderful coastal road, before we reach the ancient city of Perge. Around 1500 B.C. the Hittites settled down in a place we know as Perge. However some people believe that Perge was founded by Mopsus and Calchas in the 13th century B.C. Invaded by Alexander the Great, much of Perge's architectural splendor is a living proof of the Hellenistic period. You will depart for Aspendos where you will visit the Antique **Theatre of Aspendos.** The most important property of the theatre with the capacity of 15,000 people is its solidity. After many earthquakes, Aspendos is still standing with its astonishing architecture. There are the boxes of selected citizens on the main entrances. The upper side of the auditorium is surrounded by 58 columns and a gallery consisted of an arch. The whole auditorium has 20 lines of seat in underside and 21 lines of seat in upper side. This theatre is built by local architects Xenon and his two brothers Curtius Chrispinus and Curtius Auscipatus in the period of the Emperor Antonius Pius (138-164). It attracts attention with its special acoustic. Continue to Side area where you will taste Local Turkish food during our lunch. After lunch you will continue with the visit of Side, one of the best-known classical sites in Turkey, was an ancient harbour whose name meant pomegranate. Today a pretty resort town, its ancient ruins, two sandy beaches, many shops and extensive tourist accommodation attract throngs of visitors, you will visit the Agora, the Apollo Temple which is situated near the sea. a fountain and necropolis.
