Today, these lovely small shops continue to sell spices and now also sell dried fruits, nuts, seeds, and other edibles. Some of the shops are gradually being transformed into shops featuring jewelry and other high

margin items. **\*\* Unique Moments** : During visit of Spice Market we will have a short break at **Ali Muhiddin Hacı Bekir's shop** – the inventor of Turkish delight. From the time of its founding during the Ottoman Empire, the name Hacı Bekir has become a legend in Ottoman and Turkish confectionery and a leading symbol of this art.

### Cappadocia



Our first stop will be **Uchisar** situated at the highest point in Cappadocia. The top of the Uchisar Castle, provides a magnificent panorama of the surrounding area with Mount Erciyes in the distance. Many rooms hollowed out into the rock are connected to each other with stairs, tunnels and passages. At the entrances of the rooms, there are millstone doors, just like the ones in the underground settlements, used to control access to these places. Due to the erosion in places of this multi-leveled castle, it is unfortunately not possible to reach all the rooms. Most of the rooms, located on the north side of the castle are in use as pigeon houses (dovecuts) today. Farmers used these cave pigeon houses to collect the droppings of pigeons which is an excellent natural fertilizer for the orchards and vineyards.

We will continue with visit of **Goreme area**. The small town of Goreme is situated in the middle of the Valley of Fairy Chimneys, surrounded by the eerie shapes and fantastic rock formations that have made the region famous. It is one of the few remaining villages where fairy chimneys and rock-hewn houses are still inhabited, and several pensions, restaurants and cafes are carved into the rock. Its biggest attraction is the Goreme Open-Air museum with over 30 beautifully frescoed Byzantine rock churches. The town makes an excellent base from which to explore the surrounding rock formations, villages, vineyards and attractions. For shoppers, carpets and Kilims are plentiful.

**Goreme National Park** which was the official state during the period of the Roman Empire, was named “Cappadocia”, which means “The Country of White Horses” in Persian. Göreme Valley is like an open-air museum.

The Goreme Open-Air Museum is the most visited of the monastic communities in Cappadocia and is one of the most famous sites in central Turkey. It is a complex comprising more than 30 rock-hewn churches and chapels containing some superb frescoes, dating from the 9th to the 11th centuries. Inconspicuous from the outside, the interiors are characteristically Byzantine with a central dome and a floor plan in the shape of a cross. We will have **lunch at a local village house** where you may see a group of women are cooking local bread together; these lovely people invite you to join them. If you want, you may try to cook traditional Turkish bread, too. Then, you are going to be taken to a traditional Turkish house, to meet the members to interact with the family. If you have already learned some little Turkish this is the right time to use local language. They like to hear your perfect Turkish. After that, you may help the local ladies to prepare the table for the lunch. Turkish cuisine is very rich. You may have one of your best meals ever. After lunch, our next stop will be to **Avanos and Cavusin Villages**. In Avanos you can try to make pottery. Continue to Ürgüp, one of the major towns of Cappadocia and which is located conveniently near many of the fairy chimney valleys. As these chimneys have come to be seen as a symbol of Cappadocia, take – home fairy chimneys chiselled from pumice.

At the end of your visits, you will return to your hotel.

### Cappadocia

#### **Early morning *optional* Hot Air Ballooning in Cappadocia**

We collect our passengers from their hotels roughly one hour before sunrise and we bring them to our base, and serve tea, coffee and cookies, as the passengers meet. Then we go to our take off field designated for that day. The balloon will be ready and waiting for you. Following a safety briefing from our pilot, we climb into the baskets and take off. During the flight we rise to altitudes of several hundred meters to give you a good view of the region, but what we do mostly is drift through the valleys and canyons and around the fairy chimneys, performing


contour flying. This sort of balloon flight is possible only in Cappadocia in the whole world. The actual flight time is between 50 to 65 minutes. On landing, we have a traditional celebration party with some champagne and cakes, and we give every passenger a commemorative flight certificate written to their names. Then, we bring our guests back to their hotels. The whole excursion takes about 3 hours from pick up to drop off. Therefore, if the passengers wish to go on a sightseeing tour during the day, they are back in time to join the tour.

We set off on a full day of sightseeing in Cappadocia. We will start with a visit to **Kaymakli Underground City**. Used to be known as Melagobia, Kaymakli was one of the biggest settlements in Cappadocia and it's 8 level underground city and the deepest of the region today. We will explore the caves of this interesting city and talk about the way of life here.

Our second stop is **Soganli Valley**, one of the most secluded and tranquil valleys in Cappadocia. We begin our hike along one side of the valley, visiting many cave churches and we return along the other side of the valley to the quaint village.

We will continue our tour with visiting of **Mustafapasa**, the former Greek Village Sinasos with spectacular architecture. After our delicious lunch at one of the former Greek Mansions here, we will walk around the village, learning about the population exchange from 1923, the wealthy merchants and locals who once thrived in this town.



Our last stop at Zelve Valley; **The Zelve Open-Air Museum**, which once housed one of the largest communities in the region, is an amazing cave town, honeycombed with dwellings, religious and secular chambers. Zelve is situated about 10 km out from Goreme on the Avanos road. Here, the Christians and Muslims lived together in perfect harmony, until 1924. Then, Christians had to leave the Valley because of the exchange of minorities between Greece and Turkey, and the Muslims were forced to **evacuate the Valley in the 50's when life became dangerous due to the risk of erosion.**

They left the site to set up a modern village, a little further on, to which they gave the name **Yeni Zelve** (New Zelve).

At the end of your visits, you will return to your hotel.
