

From here we go to the nearby Hagia Sophia, the Church of Divine Wisdom. Ranking as one of the greatest marvels of world architecture, this awe-inspiring building was constructed as a basilica in the 6th century by Byzantine Emperor Justinian. Lunch will be at **Karakol Restaurant**, located inside of the Topkapı Palace courtyard. This restaurant serves selected dishes from the Ottoman cuisine. After lunch, you will visit the Topkapi Palace, which was the imperial residence of the Ottoman Sultans for more than 400 years, which houses the priceless collections of porcelains, jewelry, calligraphy and many masterpieces of art. The tour will end with the visit to the Grand Bazaar, the legendary covered market that is the biggest souk in the world with nearly 4000 shops of antiques, jewelry and carpets. While discovering we will have a traditional coffee at Sark Kahvesi. Each variety has been prepared with a blend of traditional knowledge, experience and an abiding "Love for Coffee". Once back at the Hotel, we depart for the Nomads Restaurant, located in the nightlife district of Ortaköy, near the Bosphorus,

**Istanbul:** We will commence after breakfast with the visit to the **Underground Cistern**, the largest of the many built during the Byzantine Empire to supply the city with water. Especially fascinating because the Byzantine builders recycled many stone structures (capital heads and columns used in earlier temples). Lunch will be at Balikci Sabahattin, a famous seafood restaurant in a narrow, multistoried Ottoman style house, charmingly decorated with ceramic plates, old copperware, traditional carpets and crisp embroidered curtains in Cankurtaran/ Sultanahmet. In the afternoon you will experience a Turkish bath at The Ayasofya Hurrem Sultan Hamam, designed & built by Mimar Sinan, the chief Ottoman architect. On the way back you can treat yourself with Baklava from the masters unchanging taste in Karakoy Gulluoglu Baklavicisi (since 1949). Baklava is actually not a dessert, rather an event on itself in Istanbul. Dinner will be at Reina Club.



- Day 4 Istanbul / Pergamon / Izmir: After breakfast we will drive to the Ataturk Airport to catch our morning flight to Izmir. Upon our arrival in Izmir we will continue to Pergamon Tour. We will visit the Acropol, the steepest theatre of the ancient world, the Temple of Trojan and the Library. After lunch at Asklepion restaurant we continue on with visits to the ancient healing center of Asklepion and the Red Basilica, which is one of the Seven Churches of the Revelation. Dinner will be at a Levantine Villa's Garden, of the most notorious old English Levantine family 'the Whittalls'. The owner Edward Whittall was a reputed botanist who developed the grounds of his family villa into a botanical treasure. We will overnight in Izmir.
- Day 5 Ephesus / Bodrum: The day will start with the visit of the ruins of the ancient city of Ephesus. Our first stop will be at the Basilica of St. John, who came here with the Virgin Mary and wrote his Gospel. Once in the ancient city itself we will explore this Roman city and visit the Library of Celcius, Temple of Hadrian, the Theatre and Odeon. We will leave the ruins to drive the short distance to the House of the Virgin Mary, a site that includes a house and garden and the spot where she is believed to have spent her last years. We continue to Sirince Village for our lunch and wine tasting. In the afternoon, there will be leisure time at an old Greek Village. After that, we continue to Bodrum for the overnight. Dinner will be at Kocadon Restaurant.
- Day 6 Bodrum / Tilos (Cruise): After embarkation, our luxury gullet will sail to Tilos Island. Tilos is a small Greek Island located in the Aegean Sea. It is part of the Dodecanese group of islands and lies midway between Kos and Rhodes. After the Chief' special lunch on board, we will enjoy our swimming break. We will spend the night in Tilos.
- Day 7 Tilos / Rhodes (Cruise): We will sail to Rhodes Island early in the morning after breakfast. You may join our Old City walking tour in a day. Dinner will be at Alexis 4 Seasons Restaurant with 52 years of experience and successful presence. Overnight will be in Rhodes.
- Day 8 Rhodes / Gocek (Cruise): Early morning sail to Gocek with a swimming break in the beautiful Gocek riviera. After disembarkation, we continue to our hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Day 9 Gocek / Pamukkale After breakfast we continue to Pamukkale "the Cotton Castle" with its snow-white terraces formed by thermal waters cascading down the hillside. After enjoying our visit to this site of natural beauty we go the adjacent ruins of antique Hierapolis with its famous Necropolis, Basilica, Theatre and Plutonium. Afterwards we will have the time to swim in the Thermal Pool. We will dine and spend the night in Pamukkale.

- Day 10 Pamukkale / Konya: After breakfast we drive to Konya, a city in the Central Anatolia Region of Turkey. It is the 7<sup>th</sup> most populous city in Turkey. Visit to the mausoleum, museum and monastery complex dedicated to Mevlana Celalettin Rumi, the founder of the mystical order often referred to as the "Whirling Dervishes." Lunch will be at Horozluhan restaurant. After lunch we will visit Karatay Museum. Before dinner we will join to the private "Whirling Dervishes" ceromony, The Mevlevi order was founded after the theologian, poet and philosopher Mevlana Celaleddin Rumi (1207-1273), who in his teachings celebrated the day of death as the ultimate union with God. The Mevlevi Ritual symbolizes the mystical meaning of Divine Love and the passion for the union with the Divine Truth. The Ritual has been performed for hundreds of years in the Mevlevi Lodges. We will dine and spend the night in Konya.
- Day 11 Konya / Cappadocia: After an early breakfast we set off for Cappadocia. On the way, we will visit the 13th century Sultanhan Caravanserai, a building that ranks as one of the Seljuk masterpiece. Once we arrive in Cappadocia we will lunch in Elai Restaurant. Then continue to Kaymakli Underground City, the place early Christians hid from persecutors and then proceed to the Red Valley for wine tasting. Afterwards, we continue to our hotel in Cappadocia for dinner and overnight.
- Day 12 Cappadocia: The day will start in the morning with a Balloon tour, which provides you with a privileged platform to observe the splendor that is Cappadocia. Imagine as you effortlessly drift over unique rock formations and rich fertile valleys, all set against the dramatic volcanic landscape that formed the region over two million years ago. After lunch, we proceed to the pottery town of Avanos where Kizilirmak (Hallys), the longest river of Turkey, meanders leaving the red clay on its banks that has been the raw material of pottery for centuries. After that we go to the Open Air Museum in Goreme to visit the early Christian churches decorated with unique frescoes depicting various scenes from the Bible. We stop by Pigeon Valley near Uchisar & overnight in Cappadocia.
- Day 13 Cappadocia/Istanbul: After breakfast we leave to Kayseri Airport for our flight to Istanbul. When we arrive in Istanbul, we'll have an Exclusive Cruise with a private motor yacht on the waterway separating the continents of Asia and Europe, with the opportunity to take the pictures of marble places like the ancient wooden villas of the Ottoman period. Lunch will be at Del-mare Restaurant, situated right next to the sea in Cengelkoy. Dinner will be at the Suda Kebap located in the Su adası (Su Island) one of the most beautiful locations in Istanbul between two continents.
- Day 14 Departure Transfer to the airport for our return flights.





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
